We would like to thank each of these volunteers for their hard work, for their grand ideas and little touches, and for their great contribution to what has been described as possibly the most influential Jewish event in the world today.

First, there is the Steering Group, who started creating this event last December and will still be hard at it in January, long after the lights are switched off in Warwick. Second, we have to thank the tiny full-time office team whose perseverance, patience and hard work we rely on.

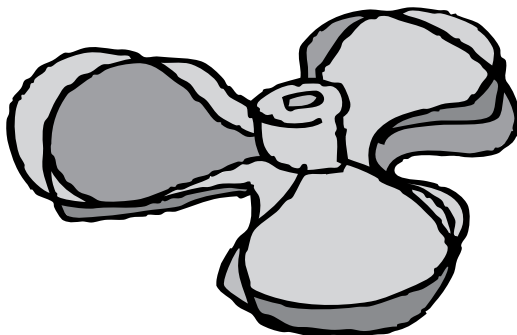

## Ten Top Tips

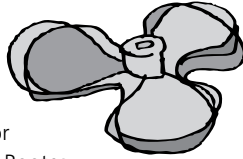
Take a deep breath and dive in... This handbook will guide and inspire you over the next few days! If you read nothing else, do read this page for some tried and trusted advice about having a great time at Conference.

### 1 Pick up a copy of the daily update sheet every day

Every morning you'll be able to pick up a copy of the daily update sheet. It will have news of unavoidable programme changes – whether a room change, a time change, a cancelled session or an added one.

Pick up your copy from

**Rootes Reception, Radcliffe** or along with your breakfast in the Rootes dining room. Nothing is worse than turning up for a presenter you've wanted to hear for ages only to find that you've missed the session.

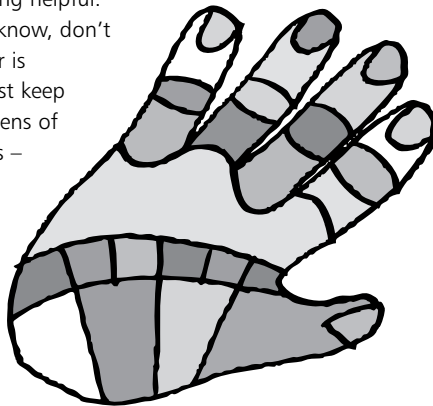


### 2 Don't go to too many sessions

There's an enormous choice of presenters, sessions, subjects, performances. It's all very tempting and there's a real danger that you'll go into overload. Don't forget that Conference is also about conversations and debates over meals, relaxing in the Limmud Lounge, drinking in Bar Limmud and meeting people you wouldn't meet anywhere else. Relax, eat, drink and enjoy!

### 3 Ask for help

People at Conference love being helpful. If there's anything you don't know, don't understand, can't work out or is otherwise perplexing you – just keep an eye out for one of the dozens of people wearing team lanyards – or ask at the Helpdesk.



### 4 Choose sessions by presenter, as well as by topic

When you're standing in the queue for lunch, or waiting for a session to start, the question to ask the Limmudnik next to you is: 'Who was good?' A superb presenter will always make their topic engaging. Every year, several unknown presenters become stars – be part of the group that heard them first!

### 5 Stay up late...

Conference doesn't stop after dinner. Some of our biggest performances are in the 22:15 slot – they're worth staying up for. We're offering midnight Chavruta and late night Israeli dancing. And there's late-night Limmud food too in the Rootes bar area.

### 6 ...or get up early

If you're an early bird, you'll find breakfast from 07:30 and sessions from 08:00. And Chavruta – study in pairs and small groups – is a Conference phenomenon that has to be seen to be believed. See the programme pages for details.

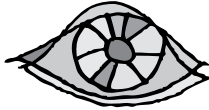
### 7 Don't join sessions late or leave before the end

It's disrespectful both to presenters and audiences. It disrupts the presenter's flow and makes it hard for the people around you to concentrate. Don't do it! If you can't get into your first choice of session, look at the rooms nearby – you might well find something unexpected you'll enjoy!

While we're on the subject of session etiquette – when you're choosing where to sit, please don't leave gaps in the row, and please leave reserved seating (near doors or gangways) for people with mobility issues. Thanks!

## 8 Try something you wouldn't normally try

Conference is a brilliant opportunity to try things you won't find anywhere else. Variety is the hallmark of Conference. It brings together all sorts of people who don't normally do Jewish things together. So keep an eye out for new experiences.



## 9 Get more out of Conference – volunteer

Conference is run almost entirely by the happy smiling volunteers you'll meet throughout the week, who have already played a part in creating Conference. You can join them! Even if you only have 10 minutes to spare, there will be something you can help with. And if Conference has inspired you, you can sign up to help create next year's event. Limmud's mission is to take participants one step further on their Jewish journey. Conference is just one of many Limmud events that run through the year – so console yourself that when it's over, there's still plenty to look forward to. ## And an extra one for Chanukah

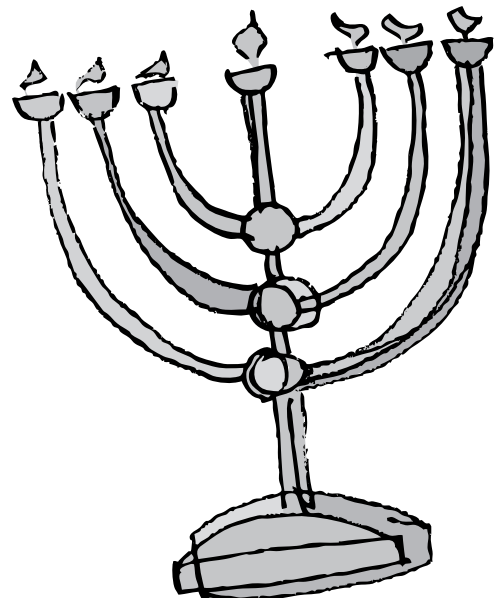
This year thanks to the calendar, we are able to celebrate Chanukah and light the chanukiah on three days of Limmud Conference.

There will be two different opportunities to light chanukiot.

We will be organising a communal chanukiah lighting session in the amphitheatre in front of Rootes (inside the Student Union in case of bad weather) beginning promptly at **16:35** and finishing at **17:00** each day.

If you wish to light your own chanukiah you will be able to do so in SU Copper Rooms 2 in the Student Union between **16:30** and **18:30**.

There is an absolute ban on lighting them in any accommodation blocks as this will set off the fire detection systems and cause great difficulties for us all. The University's fire regulations do not allow the lighting of oil-filled chanukiot.



# Conference Highlights

## New in 2011: Introduction to...

This series of sessions are designed for newcomers, those who have forgotten a lot from cheder and those who have never really learnt. Absolutely no prior knowledge is required and top-notch teachers will ensure you leave the session with more knowledge than when you came in! The titles of the sessions are 'Introduction to...'

## Beit Midrash (House of Study)

### Daily, 24 hours in Rootes Sutherland

The Beit Midrash is a space to learn Torah, engage and argue with presenters and other participants, or simply to take some time to pause, read and reflect. Learn alone or in small groups, study with our resident experts or one of a range of Limmud presenters, who will be on hand at various times.

## Dinner time programming

### Daily from 18:20-20:40

We've staggered the start times of the sessions across the dinner times so that you can take your pick – either learn from 18:40 first and then have dinner at 19:50 or have an early dinner at 18:20 and then go to the 19:10 session. The choice, as ever is yours...If you prefer to avoid any potential crowds, the least busy time in the dining room is 19:00-19:30.

## Intensives

### Daily at 11:00 and 14:00

These slots give you the opportunity to learn something in depth over the course of conference – there's a wide range of fascinating topics led by top presenters. Whilst each session is self contained, you'll get the most out of it, by attending all three or four. At both 11:00 and 14:00 half the sessions are intensives and half are one off sessions – you can identify which sessions they are by the '1/4' or '2/4' etc indicators.



## J-DOV Talks: Jewish Dreams, Observations, and Visions

### Sunday-Tuesday 15:30-16:20

An enriching and fascinating mixture of Limmud Conference with TED – the popular conference which brings inspiring speakers to give 'the talk of their life' in eighteen minutes or less – each day three presenters give us their eighteen minute talk.

## Learn While You Eat

### Sunday – Wednesday at 18:40 in Rootes Sutherland

An opportunity to have dinner with some of Limmud's best loved presenters. This is your chance to pose your burning questions and hear more from your presenters in a more informal setting. Pick up dinner as usual from Rootes Dining Room and take a seat at one of the signposted tables in Rootes Sutherland. There are limited places, so it's first come first served.

## Limmud L'Am

Limmud L'Am (Limmud for the people) is a pilot programme to make Limmud Conference more accessible to those with learning disabilities. Everyone is welcome to Limmud L'Am sessions, and Limmud's aim is that this pilot will extend across our events, and inspire other communities to improve accessibility for those with learning disabilities within their own organisations. Sessions that are designed or geared for this are marked in the handbook.

A handout which highlights sessions that are designed for Limmud L'Am can also be collected from the Helpdesk at any time during Conference.

## Yeshivat Limmud

**Monday to Thursday, 09:15 in Rootes Sutherland**

Yeshivat Limmud returns for its third year with a new line-up of superb teachers, offering four-part, in-depth yeshiva-style courses looking at classic texts of the Jewish tradition. Each double length session (finishing at around 12:10) will provide a range of options to study classic texts from the Jewish canon (in Hebrew and English), in chavruta pairs and in shiurim groups, supported by expert teachers. If you want to experience Yeshivat Limmud, we ask that you attend all four sessions and you must attend sign up at the first session on Monday morning at 09:15 in Rootes Sutherland.

### New To Limmud? So Are We!

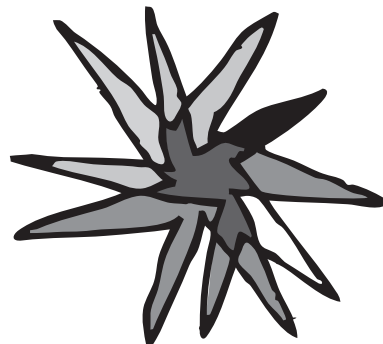
**Sunday at 19:10 in Rootes Chancellors 1**

# Assistance and information

## Helpdesk

Rootes Reception is where you'll find the Helpdesk. It's open every day from 08:30 to 22:00. Outside these hours, if you really need to speak to someone in an emergency, contact 07570 891 004.

### Help for presenters

This is also the place to go if you're a presenter and you need help with session-related queries (eg session change requests, session resources and photocopying, international presenter travel).



### Help with accommodation

And it's the place to go if you have a query about your accommodation. Fulfilling everyone's accommodation requests is a big and complex task. Once rooms have been assigned, making changes is difficult and might not be possible at all. Heating will be on in your bedroom from 06:00 – 11:00 and 18:00 – 02:00.

### Please bear in mind

That the Helpdesk is run by Limmud volunteers and they might need time to deal with your question. You might be asked to leave your query and to return later for an answer.

## Accessibility

Volunteers will be on hand to help you getting around campus. Please speak to the Helpdesk if you require assistance.

Nearly all session rooms are fitted with hearing loops. We have asked all presenters to use the room microphone to ensure the hearing loop works, but if you have a hearing aid, you may want to remind presenters of this. We have tried to ensure presenters who request photocopies are given some large print copies, ask them if you would like one. See next page for Mobility bus details

## Limmud L'Am

Limmud L'Am is an exciting new one day Limmud initiative running for the first time at this year at Conference. 'L'Am' means 'for the people', and our aim in running this day is to ensure that any individual who would like to attend and participate in Conference is able to feel part of the Limmud community. To do this we have developed sessions and support to enable adults with additional learning needs to access a day of Limmud Conference.

Our hope is that this pilot will, in time, enable more days of Conference to include specifically developed sessions, so that Limmud is accessible for more of our community. We also hope that other communities will be inspired and will share their experiences and join us in improving accessibility within their own organisations.

We're pleased that those joining us for Limmud L'Am on Tuesday, will be able to join us in lighting the communal chanukiah for the last night of Chanukah. In addition, some sessions developed with those with learning disabilities in mind will be taking place (although all are welcome!), so look out for them in your handbook. Come along to find out more.

## Notice boards

We've provided dedicated display boards and tables in Rootes Reception where you can leave leaflets and put up posters. Please don't put posters up anywhere else – they will be removed disposed of and you might find yourself landed with a bill from the University for any damaged paintwork.

## Services and minyanim

Limmud doesn't organise services or minyanim (prayer groups), but you are welcome to arrange your own and to post details on the notice boards. Some have already been arranged for Shabbat – details in the Shabbat handbook. As long as you let us know, we'll do our best to find you a space – come to the Helpdesk.

## Parking restrictions

They will be fully in force on the University campus during Conference. Do not park in any unauthorised car parks or on main roads such as Gibbet Hill Road and University Road – the University authorities will clamp and tow your car.

This is completely outside Limmud's control and if it happens to your car, you will be responsible for paying the fine and arranging release of your vehicle. Limmud does not have the discretion to waive the fine and we have no influence whatsoever over the University in this matter.

## Checking out

### Leaving Thursday

Vacate your room by 10:00 and return your key to the deregistration desk. You can store luggage in the Students Union.

### Leaving any other time

Vacate your room by 09:30 – and return your key to the Helpdesk. You can store luggage in Rootes – please ask at the Helpdesk.

If you want to donate your key deposit we'll be very grateful. Warwick charges us for missing keys – so please return your key even if you're donating the deposit.

## Mobility bus

We've organised a bus service to help you get around the site if you have mobility difficulties. It runs at these times:

- Sunday 12:00 – 21:00
- Monday to Wednesday 09:00 – 21:00
- Thursday 09:00 – 12:00

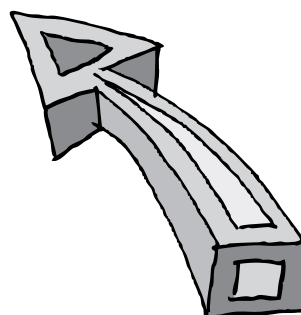
If you need to use the bus, please let the Participant Care team know – they're at the Helpdesk and will tell you everything you need to know.

We are very grateful to Jewish Care who have provided the mobility bus for this year's Conference.

## Transport home

Coaches for those who have booked a place will depart on Thursday at 14:30 (after the participants' photo). Please meet outside Rootes and you will be directed to the right coach. Coach seats will be allocated on a first come first served basis to those who have booked a place; please arrive promptly to avoid delaying the departure of coaches

If you have booked a place on a return coach but won't be using it, please tell the Helpdesk so that we know not to wait for you. Unfortunately, however, we can't refund your fare. There may be some spare places on the coaches – do check at the Rootes Helpdesk if you want a seat but haven't booked. The cost is £25 per person.



# Your security and health

**In an emergency, dial 22222 from the emergency services from any campus phone, or 999 from a mobile.**

## Emergencies

The fastest and most effective way of getting help is to call **22222** from any internal University of Warwick telephone. The University emergency control centre will offer assistance and call the emergency services, directing them to the correct campus location.

If there is no internal telephone nearby, call **999** from a mobile.

If you need to speak to a member of the Limmud Conference team in an emergency please call **07570 891 004**.

## Fire

- If you hear an alarm immediately leave the building you're in via the nearest exit.
- Stay calm.
- Go to the nearest assembly point as directed by fire marshals (in yellow jackets).
- Do not linger in doorways as this slows everyone down – especially the fire service.
- Never re-enter a building, even once an alarm falls silent, until you are told to do so by the fire service or university security (not Community Security Trust or the Limmud team, who don't have the authority).
- Never assume that it is a false alarm. Until the cause is identified you must assume it is a genuine fire and treat it as such.

## Security

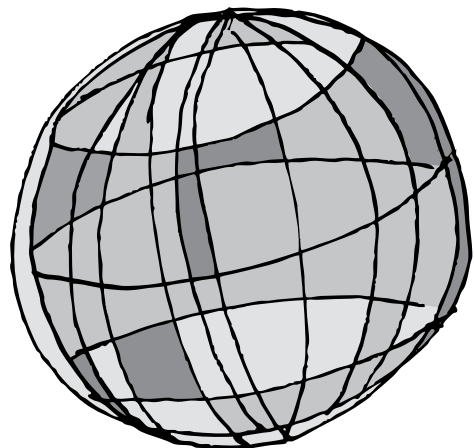
If you see anything suspicious, without delay:

- inform a Community Security Trust (CST) officer if nearby or call the Community Security Trust onsite control **07967 191244**
- or tell a University security officer
- or tell a Conference volunteer

You must wear your ID badge visibly (outside clothing) at all times. You will need your badge to gain access to all buildings.

Security at Conference is provided by the Community Security Trust, who are working with the Warwick University security team.

Neither Limmud, CST nor Warwick University accepts responsibility for your car or personal belongings.



## Medical

### Conference paramedic

There will be a paramedic available on campus during the daytime and early evening from Sunday 25 December until Conference ends. The paramedic will be based in Rootes – ask at the Helpdesk if you need access to the paramedic.

### General medical practices and out of hours primary care

The Helpdesk has details of those General Practices close to Campus who may be able to see participants on a 'temporary patient' basis when their surgeries are open.

When General Practices are closed, urgent primary care will be provided under the local out of hours arrangements – call 08456 080275. Callers will be asked the Campus postcode, which is **CV4 7AL**.

### NHS Direct

NHS Direct provides information and advice about health, illness and health services, to enable patients to make decisions about their healthcare. **NHS Direct are also likely to ask for the caller's postcode: CV4 7AL on campus.**

### Pharmacies

The Helpdesk has details of local pharmacies, and their opening hours over the Conference period.

### Eligibility for medical care

The NHS provides free NHS medical care for all who need it in emergency, usually at an Accident and Emergency department but occasionally at a General Practitioner (GP) practice. People registered with a GP in the UK who need urgent primary medical care whilst away from their normal residence can request any GP practice to see them as a temporary patient.

People from overseas are only eligible for free NHS health care for a clinical emergency, unless there is a reciprocal agreement with the other country. This does not include worsening of a current medical condition, forgotten medication, etc. If urgent medical care is needed, the general medical practices above can offer a private consultation, but you'll have to pay. Adequate medical insurance is advisable.

## Dinner time programming

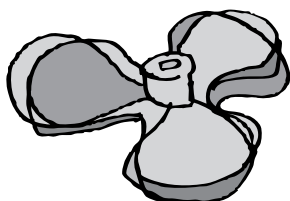
We've staggered the start times of sessions over dinner time, so that we don't have everyone rushing for dinner at the same time!

Take your pick... go for an early dinner from 18:20, then head off to one of the late-starting sessions at 19:10; or else catch an early session at 18:40, with dinner to follow when that finishes at 19:50.

If you prefer to avoid the crowds, you'll find the dining room at its quietest from around 19:10 to 19:50. If you do come and the queues are long, please be patient and follow the instructions of the queue marshals.

## Butterworth

There will be a meat meal in a more relaxed setting accompanied by music in Butterworth Hall in the Arts Centre starting at 18.30. In order to attend dining in Butterworth you will need to obtain a free ticket from the Helpdesk in Rootes in advance.



## Family dining

Family breakfast will be served from Monday to Thursday mornings between 07:30 and 09:00 in Radcliffe. A range of cereals, toast, cheese, yoghurts, and hot and cold drinks will be available. Hot breakfast is served each morning in the Rootes Dining Room.

On Sunday, ahead of the start of Young and Teen Limmud and the Limmud Nursery, we will be offering lunch for families in Radcliffe from 12:00. On other days, lunch will be available at a selection of Grab 'n' Go points round campus and in the Rootes Dining Room.

Dinner – including a separate children's menu – will be available to families in Rootes Dining Room on Sunday to Wednesday from 17:00 to 18:00.

We will endeavour to have a couple of volunteers on hand to help you fetch and carry food for your family if you need an extra pair of hands.

## Baby food

Freshly prepared vegetable and fruit purées are available on request in Rootes dining room during meal times.

## Kashrut

All food served is certified kosher by the London Beth Din. Please help us to maintain kashrut by not bringing food from elsewhere into public spaces. The vending machines and other food outlets on campus including the café on the ground floor of the Arts Centre are not stocked or run by Limmud and therefore contain food items that are not kosher.

## Special dietary requirements

If you have informed us of any special dietary requirements, please make yourself known to the catering team soon after your arrival. All food is labelled with allergen information but if you are concerned about allergies, please speak to a member of the catering team.

Tzedakah projects are at the heart of Conference – this year run by Young and Teen Limmud, who will be choosing the projects that Conference will be supporting.

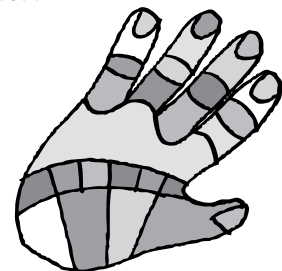
There will be plenty of opportunities to have fun and support these excellent projects throughout Conference. Here are some of the things we might be doing:

## Limmud Nursery

Limmud provides a nursery programme for babies, toddlers and pre-schoolers, located in Radcliffe.

Limmud Nursery has its own dedicated entrance – please follow the signposts.

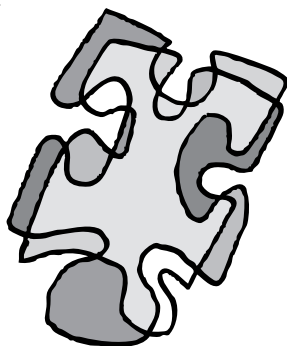
Limmud Nursery is open from 09:00 to 15:45 daily. On Sunday, the Nursery will open at 13:30. On Thursday, it will close at 13:00. The nursery closes for lunch on all other days from 12:30 to 13:30, when you'll need to collect your children and take them to lunch.

The nursery is run by qualified staff, and children are grouped into a base room by age.

We will supply light snacks and drinks (water and juice). For each crèche session, please ensure you provide a named bag containing:

- at least three nappies, wipes, nappy sacks, creams and anything else we might need
- at least one complete change of clothes
- a beaker or bottle with your child's name on it.

It is essential that nursery staff are able to contact you at all times, so please leave written details of the sessions you will be attending and a mobile number. Please don't forget to leave your mobile switched on, but on 'silent' or 'discreet' mode during sessions. In order to ensure the welfare, health and safety of all children in the nursery, we reserve the right to not accept any child who is unwell. If any child displays signs of illness, we will consult with our medics and on their advice may need to ask the parent or guardian to remove their child for a set period. We kindly ask all parents/guardians for their full cooperation.



## Young Limmud and Teen Limmud

Young Limmud is a programme designed for young people aged 4-13 and Teen Limmud for people from 14-17. Together they have evolved to become the biggest provider of Jewish youth work during the winter in the UK with over 200 young people participating each year.

Young and Teen Limmud believe that all Conference participants, regardless of age, should be included, cared for and given access to activities that enable them to take one step further on their Jewish journey.

### Daily arrival and registration

Upon arrival registration will take place in the room your child will be in for the duration of the programme.

There you will be able to meet the madrichim (leaders) and the rosh (team leader) who will be working with your child.

If you have any questions, you'll be able to ask a member of the Young and Teen Limmud team when you drop off your child in Radcliffe reception.

### Guidelines

We are keen to ensure that our childrens' activities run smoothly. For this reason, we hope you understand when we ask that you don't drop by during the day to see how your child is doing, unless you've arranged to do so with the rosh – this can be very disruptive to the group's activities and can pose a security risk.

We also ask that you don't remove your child from the programme during the day, again unless you've arranged this with the rosh beforehand or unless the rosh feels that it's necessary.

## What happens at Young Limmud?

### Venue

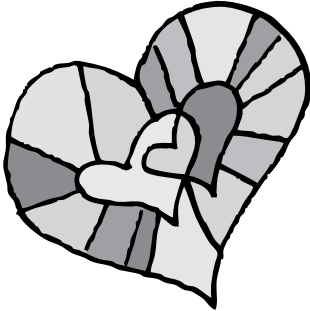
Young Limmud Conference takes place each day in Radcliffe.

Young Limmud madrichim prepare a tailor made programme, filled with creative activities such as drama, arts and crafts as well as outdoor sports.

### Venue

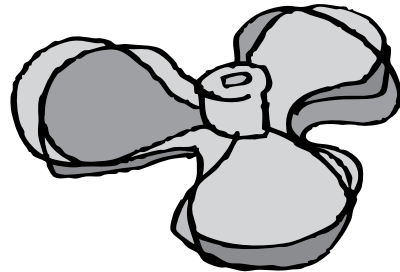
Teen Limmud participants have their own private space for their programme. We want to make sure they have the independence all teenagers need. They will be in Ramphal during the day and have a dedicated lounge during the evening.

### Education

Teen Limmud participants split their time between main Conference sessions, sessions with presenters we've brought in especially for them and exciting and engaging activities planned and run by their highly experienced madrichim.

### Volunteering and the Tzedakah project

This year Teen Limmud has been given the responsibility of choosing the projects Conference will support and then running the whole of the Conference tzedakah project.

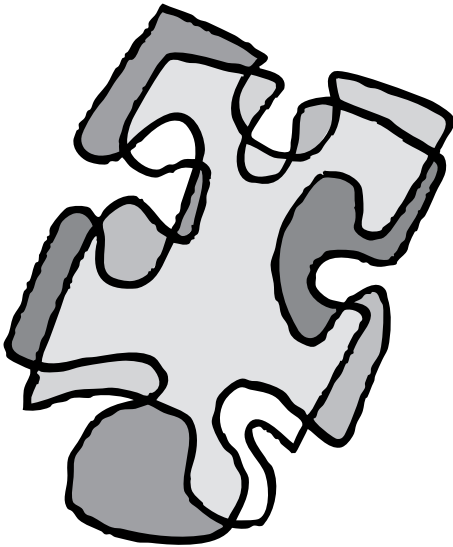

## Family dining

Families will be able to have an earlier dinner in Rootes dining room from 17:00 to 18:00. A separate children's menu will be available alongside the adult menu at this time only.

Baby food – vegetable and fruit purées – is available on request in Rootes dining room during meal times.



## Babysitting

Babysitting is now available for all children in year 3 and below from 19:55 to 23:40 each evening. All babysitters are volunteers, so please treat them with respect and ensure that they are able to enjoy Conference to the maximum.

Each evening, when the babysitter arrives, he or she will have been briefed to expect a handover from you about your children. We're providing what is essentially a listening service – your children should be settled in their bedrooms. Babysitters are not expected to put children to bed and will stay outside the rooms, unless a child cries and needs to be comforted. Children aged 8-9 (year 3) who make use of the extended babysitting service are expected to be ready for bed and to remain in their rooms, or their friends' rooms, quietly.

The babysitter will not be able to leave until you return and relieve them, so please ensure that you return no later than 23:40 every night.

To use the babysitting service you will need to complete and sign a babysitting form on arrival at Conference, setting out the terms of the service. If you don't abide by these terms, particularly if you do not return by the designated time, we reserve the right to withdraw babysitting services from you, both at this Conference and at future events.

## Night Club

Night Club is a programme designed to make Conference evenings the best they can be for its young participants, with a wide range of exciting activities developed just for them.

It's for Young and Teen Limmud participants in school years 3-8 and takes place every evening from 19:30 to 22:00 in Ramphal. On Wednesday, it will run from 18:30 to 20:15.
