Making Jewish Films: Israeli Settlers and Eviction – Facing A New Political Reality

In the summer of 2005, 22 settlements in the Gush Qatif region (the Gaza Strip) were disbanded and 6,000 Israeli Jews evicted from their homes, in a political process called 'Disengagement'. Director Ohad Domb, then a student at the Ma'aleh Film School, decided to dedicate both his graduate films, one fictional and one documentary, to the subject of settlement evacuation. Ohad has travelled with his two prize-winning films to festivals all over the world. Both films will be screened at the session, and Ohad will describe many of the artistic and practical challenges he encountered in the making of the films.

Freedom in Music, Freedom in Israel

Coolooloosh music is based on a lot of free spirit improvisation and a majority of the music is created by playing free and open sessions.

The band will discuss the ways of creating music and the importance of freedom in this process.

Rebel Sun – the bands MC has undergone a long struggle against the Israeli government that refused to grant him and his family a permit to stay in Israel.

The band joined forces with the best of the Israeli Hip-Hop scene to record a protest song titled *Fight Rebel Sun*. The story received massive media coverage and finally in April 2007 Rebel Sun was granted an Israeli citizenship.

Rebel Sun will tell his story of fighting for freedom as a Jew in the holy land.

Climate Change – A Crisis for the World’s Poor

You can hear directly from campaigners and will have a unique opportunity to discuss these issues with a representative of those communities most affected. We will also be looking at ways we can all play a part in combating this injustice. Two of the marchers – Simon White from the UK and Rosalía Soley from El Salvador – will be diverting from their main route especially to join us.
